

COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 14-14

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT CONCERNING Residency Requirements for Membership on the Queen Anne's County Economic Development Commission;

FOR THE PURPOSE of allowing non-residents of Queen Anne's County who own or are the principal of a business located in Queen Anne's County to be appointed to the Queen Anne's County Economic Development Commission; and dealing generally with residency requirements for boards and commissions in Queen Anne's County;

BY AMENDING Section 4-10 B. of the Code of Public Local Laws of Queen Anne's County, Maryland.

SECTION I

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF QUEEN ANNE'S COUNTY, MARYLAND that Section 4-10 B. of the Code of Public Local Laws be amended to read as follows:

§ 4-10 County staff and appointments.

- A. Staff. Except as otherwise provided by law, the County Commissioners may provide for the appointment and removal of County officers and employees and set their compensation.**
- B. Boards and commissions. No person shall be appointed by the County Commissioners to any board or commission in the County unless such person is a resident of Queen Anne's County and any person so appointed shall, upon relinquishing his residency in Queen Anne's County, be considered to have resigned from such board or commission provided, however, that the owner or principal of a business located in Queen Anne's County may be appointed to the Queen Anne's County Economic Development Commission regardless of their County of residence. The foregoing provisions shall not apply to any person whose membership on a board or commission is required by governmental law, rule or regulation or by virtue of such person's employment or position.**

SECTION II

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on the forty-sixth (46th) day following its adoption.
